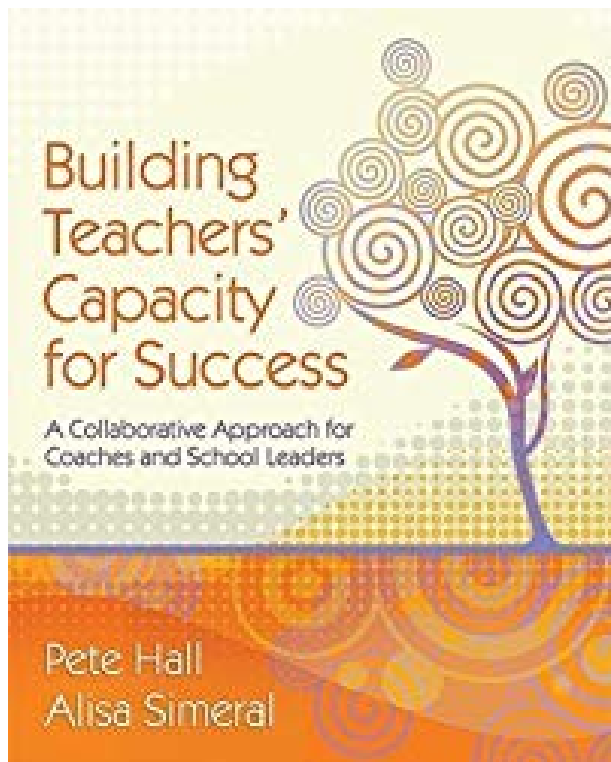


Building Teachers' Capacity for Success: A Collaborative Approach for Coaches and School Leaders
