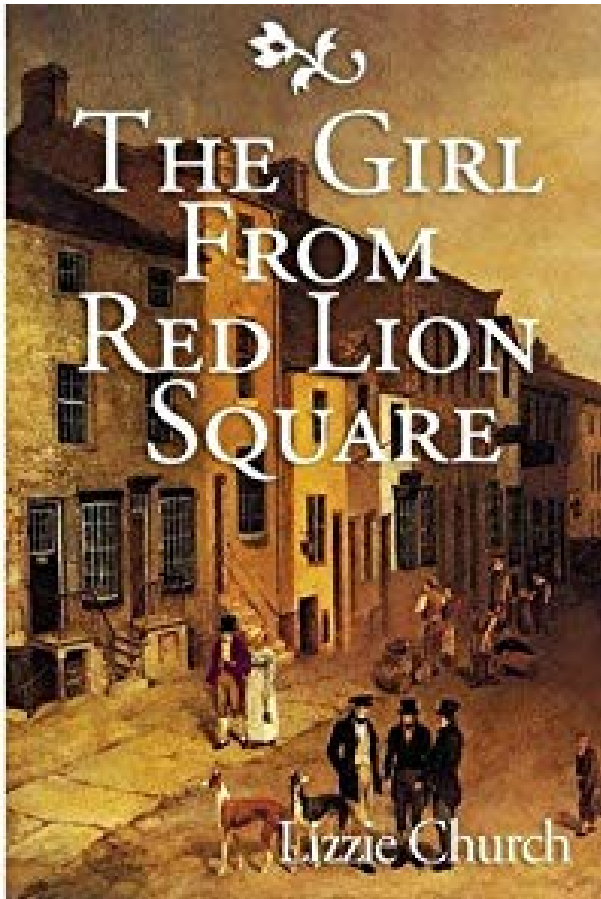

In many ways the years of the Regency were remarkably similar to our own – huge inequalities of wealth, political unrest, economic turmoil.
